The Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) provides funding to a network of service providers who assist Kansans experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless. Funding is used to help homeless individuals and families, improve the number and quality of emergency shelters, support operation of shelters, provide essential services to shelter residents, rapidly re-house homeless individuals and families, and prevent homelessness.

ESG Funds are used by service organizations for:

STREET OUTREACH

Meeting individuals where they are at. Providing essential medical and mental health services, transportation, and case management.

SHELTER

Safety for those who need it most. Providing child care, education services, job placement, substance abuse treatment, and legal services.

8 emergency shelters funded

12 domestic violence shelters funded

350 beds provided, 2,295 Kansans served

RAPID RE-HOUSING

Unlocking home for Kansas. Providing short-term rental assistance, moving costs, safety deposits, and utility assistance.
